Georges Janssens, son of Robert Mondavi winemaker Genevieve Janssens, and Anja Cheriakova, Dutch but originally from Belarus, have just set off round the world on their World Wine Tour 2010, hoping to collect bottles of wine for a charity auction and learn and disseminate something about wines off the beaten track as they go. This week they are in Moscow participating in a Crimean wine event.
